Slim Messenger Bag

Sewing Tools You Need

- Sewing Machine and standard presser foot; we used the Janome 4120QDC
- Zipper foot

Fabric and Other Supplies

NOTE: We recommend a heavier weight fabric like a twill or canvas for the exterior of this bag, a plaid flannel for the flap and accents, and a quilting cotton for the lining

- ½ yard of 44"+ wide mid weight fabric for the main exterior panels and flap lining; we used Big Sur 9.6 oz canvas in Navy from Robert Kaufman Fabrics
- ⅛ yard of 44"+ wide mid weight fabric for the exterior accent corners; we used Kobe 6 oz twill in Bone from Robert Kaufman Fabrics
- ½ yard of 44"+ wide plaid flannel or similar for the exterior flap and strap accents; we used Durango Flannel in Americana from Robert Kaufman Fabrics

NOTE: Amount listed allows extra for fussy-cutting the plaid.

- 1 yard of 44"+ wide quilting weight fabric for the lining; we used Magic Dragon in Scarlet from the Good Knight collection from Michael Miller Fabrics.

NOTE: This amount also includes extra for fussy cutting a directional fabric. As always, check the exact cut dimensions in the Getting Started section below to see if you might be able to use a smaller cut if you choose not to fussy cut.

- ONE package of piping in a color to coordinate with the exterior accent corners; we used Wrights Maxi Piping in Oyster
- 1 yard of 20"+ wide one-sided fusible foam; such as Pellon Flex Foam
- ¼ yard of 45"+ wide mid-weight fusible interfacing, such as Pellon Décor Bond

- 2½ yards of 1" cotton webbing for the side straps and adjustable strap
- 1 yard of ¾" twill tape or similar for the flap accent strips
- Hardware:
 - TWO 1" Swivel Hooks; such as Dritz Fashion Swivel Hooks - we used an antique brass finish
 - TWO 1" D-Rings; such as Dritz Fashion D-Rings - we used an antique brass finish
 - ONE 1" Slide Buckle; such as Dritz Fashion Slide Adjusters - we used an antique brass finish
 - TWO Metal Push Locks; such as Dritz Press Locks - we used an antique brass finish
- All purpose thread to match fabric
- Transparent thread for strap stitching; *optional* – you can also use all-purpose thread to match the fabric
- See-through ruler
- Fabric pen or pencil
- Iron and ironing board
